Through strong relationships and community engagement, we address challenges across the five boroughs, ensuring meaningful service shows up wherever it's needed.



The Central Source for Service in NYC

New York Cares works year-round to ensure all New Yorkers in need have the tools to live. work, and play with dignity. While there are far too many programs to list, we've included a few highlights showcasing the breadth and depth of our collective impact.

9/11 Day

Every year, New York Cares partners with 9/11 Day to recruit and train hundreds of volunteer leaders to guide more than 5,000 volunteers on the Intrepid Museum as they pack hundreds of thousands of meals for New Yorkers in need. More than 20 years later, we are proud to support this one-of-a-kind volunteer event that turns a day of tragedy into triumph through unity and service.

Mission: Vetcheck

For many veterans, the return to civilian life is stressful. Veterans often do not have access to public services, housing and mental health resources, or employment information to smooth that transition. Through our partnership with the New York City Department of Veterans' Services, Mission: VetCheck volunteers provide vital outreach and information, ensuring New Yorkers who have served our country are heard, supported, and appreciated-one phone call at a time.

Stand with Students

Stand with Students highlights our commitment to NYC students and schools. As a yearlong campaign for our educational programming, Stand with Students sends students, schools, and families a simple message: you are not alone. From supplying backpacks brimming with supplies to fulfilling Winter Wishes during the holiday season and providing a range of educational and recreational programs throughout the school year, we work to address the underlying challenges of poverty. Our volunteer-powered programs aim to ensure that every student we meet feels supported and understood.

Winter Wishes

This heartwarming program is about more than gifts; it's about delivering a fun, exciting experience that respects the dignity and individuality of each child and teen participating. In a year when so many New Yorkers faced uncertainty, our wish granters provided immeasurable joy by fulfilling 20,311 wishes at family shelters, public housing providers, and Title 1 schools during the holiday season.

College Access

In NYC's affluent neighborhoods, up to 85% of adults have a bachelor's degree. In some lowerincome areas, the percentage of individuals with a bachelor's drops to as low as 7%. Our College Access programs - Teen Education, College Prep, SAT Prep, and Financial Aid Assistance - help to close the equity education gap. In 2023, New York Cares created nearly 2,000 volunteer positions across 367 College Access projects totaling 3,780 hours spent with teens and families.

Coat Drives are a Team Sport

New York Sports ♥ Keeping NYC Warm

Every year, the New York Cares Coat Drive exemplifies the spirit of unity and compassion among New Yorkers and shines a light on our city's ability to rally around those in need. The 35th Annual New York Cares Coat Drive marked a milestone, boasting unprecedented success and community engagement. We collaborated with WE **Y** NYC and iconic institutions like the FDNY, all NY sports teams and leagues, including the NBA, MLB, NFL, and NHL, and beloved hometown teams like the NY Mets, NY Rangers and NY Islanders, NY Liberty, and New York Jets. Our partnership, in tandem with corporate and individual collections, led to the distribution of a remarkable 73,111 coats. This collaborative effort underscores the ethos of teamwork that keeps our fellow New Yorkers warm when the weather turns cold.

Coat Drives are a team effort, and we were fortunate to have big players step up to the plate. Thanks to global logistics leader UPS, we transported tens of thousands of coats throughout the drive and equipped collections with labels to ship more than 1,000 UPS packages. Home Depot donated more than 2,000 boxes and Piece of Cake Moving provided the resources for more than 25 moves as well as 2,500 large shipping boxes for coat collections. Additionally, Vornado Realty generously provided our large warehouse space, the MTA collaborated on transit hub promotion, and the New York City Fire Department (FDNY) ran collection sites across the five boroughs. These partnerships amplify our impact and embody the grit and compassion of New Yorkers.
